Talk in Preston

May saw us up in the church learning about bats. The Warwickshire Bat group gave us a very informative talk dispelling many commonly held beliefs. Then we went out around Preston with bat detectors to listen out for the bats around us. It wasn't ideal weather but we all heard evidence of bats which we couldn't always see in the evening sky.

10 July

Moth Traps and Bacon Baps

Ron and Di hosted a very successful moth trap and bacon bap morning event. David Brown, who is a local expert, came the night before, set his traps and then we were able to see the moths the following morning. We were all amazed by the variety, beauty and interesting descriptive names from heart and dart to lunar spotted pinion. David identified in excess of forty different species which sounds good but there are potentially around six hundred in Warwickshire, many more than butterflies.

We have at last submitted our habitat survey and are hoping for some feedback at some stage. It was quite an epic project but served to teach us all a lot about environmental management and the importance of monitoring changes.



The wildflower patch by the road sign has been added to with plug plants and we will have to wait and see what appears. The patch in the churchyard has been left to its own devices. It had quite a lot of colour last spring so it will be interesting to see what happens there.



We managed to submit a butterfly survey but it was a bit patchy as were the butterfly sightings, mainly due to the poor weather conditions.







Our regular walks continue to be an important part of our group activities. Last year saw outings to areas close – Alderminster, Stratford and Ilmington, slightly further afield to Snowshill, Moreton-in-Marsh, Lowsenford and a historical flavour thanks to Mick and Ron to Kenilworth. We also had Ron to thank for the stunning bluebell walk at Badby and another walk with a poetic theme; Brock and others celebrated Edward Thomas with a walk at Adlestrop. 


2017-THE YEAR SO FAR
