The story so far and what we will be doing in 2016...

Habitat Survey

In March 2015, we attended our training day to enable us to carry out a survey for Warwickshire Wildlife Trust which was led by Chris Talbot. This equipped us to undertake the survey and we started the work in June.

Armed with reference books, cameras and binoculars we went off to see what was around. The results of this work are currently being collated and should be online to look at in the next couple of months.









Wildflower Beds

April, several PEG members dug two wildflower beds, one at the entrance to the village and one in the new cemetery. A mix of seeds was sown and we waited, and waited until seedlings began to appear. By mid- June they were looking good with a mix of annuals including poppies and cornflowers. This was an experiment to see what could be achieved and to gauge the reaction of villagers. We plan to extend the bed by the sign this year.







PEG Walks

We started a monthly walk with the aim of getting out into the countryside and seeing what plants, birds and animals were about. We saw deer, hares, wildfowl, bluebells and orchids to name just a few. One of the highlights of the year was the Laurie Lee walk in Slad. This was a perfect day and we were guided by an orchid expert to see many different species during the day, plus some poetry too. Thanks to Ron for organising this and to Chris for driving. the minibus.



















Education

As we are all keen to learn and increase our knowledge of the natural history around us we have been to several workshops including 'Identifying Winter Trees', a 'Fungi Foray' plus lectures on barn owls, hedgehogs and grasses. We put on a very successful event in the village hall when Brigit Strawbridge came to talk to us about bees and their plight. It was very well attended and not only did we learn a lot about bees, but we also made some money for PEG funds. We have also taken part in the Great Garden Bird Watch and the Butterfly count.

Other good things

We have been on two farm visits with Will Spencer to see the changing seasons on the farm. On the second visit Will showed us a harvest mouse nest. Following on from this, a researcher from Warwickshire Wildlife Trust has started a harvest mouse survey. Some of us, at very short notice, were lucky enough to help with this project and found several more nests of this lovely, yet endangered species. There have been some successful barn owl nests in 2015 and the ringing group came out to weigh and ring the chicks.
